Dear Friends,

On a chilly Sunday morning last February, I walked up to our Community Veterinary Clinic, hosted in the parking lot of one of our community's most impoverished neighborhoods, at 7:30 a.m. A line of over 100 people stood there with their animals, bundled up with blankets, snuggling their pets, ready to be there as long as it took to make sure they could get them care.

At the head of the line, a different group of over 20 volunteers and team members were in full swing prepping to spend their Sunday giving those animals care; setting out donations, assembling tables, pulling up vaccines, setting up canopies.

And suddenly it hit me, just like that – *this is what love looks like.* Love in action.

Access to care for all animals has been a founding principle of our organization for over 18 years. It gets to the root causes of animal homelessness by keeping animals healthy and in the homes with the families that love them, and by preventing unwanted litters.

Last year, your support helped us bring free and low-cost veterinary care and spay/neuter to over 7,782 animals living in poverty on both sides of the border. That's a whole lot of love!

And, all the while we work to dismantle the root causes of animal homelessness and neglect, we continue to rescue those animals who are in the greatest need; the abused, the sick, the neglected, the forgotten. We rescue them, heal them, love them and make them whole again.

Thanks to you, we are fulfilling our mission to reach the most vulnerable animals living in the impoverished communities we serve. And, we will continue to push forward and bring love and care where it is most needed, grateful for and steadied by the unwavering support and compassion of each and every one of you.

Highlights



Free Clinic in Mexico Passes 15,000 Mark

Our free spay/neuter clinic in Mexico surpassed 15,000 surgeries this past year! This clinic offers free sterilization and veterinary wellness services to over 400 animals south of the border each and every month.



Mexico Puppy Orphanage

This was the first full year for our newest animal shelter, a puppy orphanage for abandoned homeless puppies and nursing mother dogs with their litters, located in Puerto Peñasco, Mexico. This critically important rescue center provided specialized care and rescue to over 500 of Mexico's most vulnerable animals.



Award-Winning Work

CWOB co-founder Dr. Christi Camblor was chosen for a North Bay Spirit Award highlighting outstanding community service providers, launching CWOB onto the front pages of local newspapers and prompting a video piece on Comcast. Additionally, the entire Camblor family, the founders of CWOB and their son, were chosen as Red Cross Animal Heroes, a national honor recognizing extraordinary service.



Mutttopia On-site Surgical Clinic Set to Launch

We are thrilled to announce that we are putting the final touches on an on-site surgical and dental clinic at Mutttopia, our safe space for homeless dogs co-created by CWOB and CAPE. This facility will greatly enhance our ability to provide the high-quality veterinary care the animals there need prior to adoption.



Access to Care for Low-Income Communities in the U.S.

CWOB hosted numerous free and low-cost veterinary and spay/neuter clinics to underserved communities in the U.S. with a primary focus on low-income Latino neighborhoods and the homeless. We were able to reach over 1,300 animals through these community clinics, preventing unwanted litters and keeping animals healthy and in the homes of the families who love them.

MEXICO PROGRAMS

CLINICA ESPERANZA:

Community Veterinary and Spay/Neuter Clinic

Our free clinic in Puerto Peñasco, Mexico offers sterilizations, along with veterinary wellness care, to over 4,000 animals each year. The clinic, which specializes in high-quality high-volume spay and neuter, is staffed by two veterinarians, along with five other full-time support staff.

"This clinic is a huge resource for the community. Before it started there was virtually no access to, or awareness about, spay and neuter and even if people did want to get their animals fixed, it was too expensive for just about everyone in the area. Now, everybody knows Clinica Esperanza is the place to go, and we are filled to the brim each and every day with animals who otherwise would not have access to these important services."

PROJECT HOPE PUPPY ORPHANAGE:

Specialized shelter for underage pups and nursing mother dogs and their litters

Homeless puppies are amongst some of Mexico's most at-risk animals given their susceptibility to disease, young age, and need for advanced care. So, too, are female dogs who give birth to their litters on the streets and are then forced to fend for themselves and their pups in a precarious environment. That is why our Project Hope Puppy Orphanage is such an important safe haven. Each year, this shelter takes in and provides care to over 500 animals in need.



VIDA FELIZ RESCUE CENTER:

Shelter and rehabilitation center for homeless street dogs

Street dogs in Mexico face very difficult lives, often resulting in starvation, severe infections, anemia and injury. Our Vida Feliz Rescue Center is a refuge for these animals; a place for them to come to receive veterinary care, love, nutrition and the care they need. Each year this shelter takes in over 600 animals off the streets, housing them and rehabilitating them for months before they are fully healed and then transported north for adoption in California.



OUR PROGRAMS



CENTRAL VALLEY RESCUE PROGRAM

Since 2011, CWOB has had a focus on rescuing the most at-risk animals from California's Central Valley, where euthanasia rates are amongst the highest in the country. Our focus is working with our partners to identify the animals in greatest need of rescue, most often due to illness or injury. We take those animals in, provide them with the care they need, and then find them the loving homes they deserve.

"Since Fresno Humane took over Fresno County's animal services nearly four years ago we have worked desperately to improve euthanasia rates, but animals that require extensive medical care continue to be one of our most at-risk populations. Animals frequently come in with extensive medical issues that we do not have the funds or staff to address. We currently do not have veterinary staff or medical facilities on site and are unable to offer the intensive care many of them require. Without Compassion Without Borders stepping up time and time again, many of these animals would have had to be euthanized." -Brenda Mitchell, President, Fresno Humane Animal Services



FREE VETERINARY CLINICS FOR THE HOMELESS

Our free clinics for animals belonging to our community's homeless provide access to care to over 200 animals each year. This critically important service keeps these animals healthy and enables the people who love them to provide their animals with the veterinary care they need to thrive.



MUTTOPIA: A SAFE PLACE FOR HOMELESS DOGS

Mutttopia, our shelter in California that was co-created by CWOB and the Center for Animal Protection and Education {CAPE} in 2016, is a refuge to over 400 dogs each year. This safe haven for homeless animals gives each and every one the time, medical and emotional support, and TLC they need before being adopted out into loving homes.



COMMUNITY CLINICS FOR LOW-INCOME FAMILIES

CWOB hosts low-cost veterinary wellness and spay/neuter clinics in underserved communities in northern California, with over 1,300 animals helped each and every year. These bilingual, grassroots clinics are hosted in the heart of low-income neighborhoods and are consistently filled to capacity with clients eager to get their pets the veterinary care they need. These clinics are vitally important for the animals we serve and the low-income community members who cherish them.
